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Nikolaos Bakatselos, President, American-Hellenic Chamber of Commerce

Nikolaos Bakatselos is the Managing Director of Pyramis Metallourgia A.E. and Pyramis Deutschland GmbH. He was a Member of the Board of Directors and Deputy Managing Director of Northern Greece Publishing S.A. He has held the position of Managing Director of Imperium AEEEX, and Member of the Board of Directors of Egnatia Bank Securities S.A. He was a Member of the Board of Directors of Attica Bank from February 2014 until June 2016. He was a Member of the Steering Committee of the International Hellenic University from 2006 until January 2014 and Member of the Board and President of the Northern Greece Committee of EEDE. He is Member of the Committee Support CERTH, Trustee of Anatolia College, Member of the Board and Member of the Steering Committee of SVE and Honorary Consul of Belgium for Northern Greece. After being a Member of the Board of Directors of the American-Hellenic Chamber of Commerce for several years, in June 2010 he was elected Vice President of the American-Hellenic Chamber of Commerce and President of the Northern Greece Committee, and since June 2019 he was elected President of the American-Hellenic Chamber of Commerce. He is a founding member and member of the Board of the Council of Competitiveness of Greece. From October 2019 until February 2022, he was elected as President of HEDNO by the General Assembly of HEDNO. Nikolaos Bakatselos holds a B.A. in Sociology from University of Reading and a MSc in Shipping, Trade and Finance from City University Business School.



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Marina Economou-Lalioti, Emeritus Professor of Psychiatry, University of Athens

Marina Economou-Lalioti is Professor Emeritus of Psychiatry at the National and Kapodistrian University of Athens (N.K.U.A.) School of Medicine. Scientific Coordinator and Head of the Social Psychiatry and Psychosocial Care Unit of the University Mental Health, Neurosciences and Precision Medicine Research Institute “Costas Stefanis” (U.M.H.R.I.). Vice President of the World Association for Psychiatric Rehabilitation (W.A.P.R.). She has been the founder of families’ movement for mental health in the country and the first mental health professional in Greece who was trained and applied Psychoeducation and Behavioral Family Management in Greece, especially in families of patients with chronic and severe mental disorders. Moreover, she has been pioneering in efforts to combat the social stigma surrounding mental disorders in Greece and she has been the Director of the “Anti-stigma Program”, which designed and implemented multifaceted initiatives for reducing the prejudice and discrimination against people with mental illness. She has also been the Scientific Head of one of the first hotline mental health services in the country (Depression Helpline). Her clinical work mainly concerns the provision of psychiatric and psychotherapeutic services and interventions addressed to both the patient and the family, focusing on Clinical Psychiatry, Psychiatric Rehabilitation, Family Therapy, Psychiatric Counseling and Psychoeducation. These cover a broad range of mental disorders, from subclinical and common mental disorders to severe and recurrent ones. Moreover, she provides e-mental health services. Her research activity is internationally acknowledged in the fields of Social Psychiatry and Psychiatric Epidemiology, especially with respect to the study of social stigma attached to mental illnesses as well as the socioeconomic determinants of mental health. She has been among the leading researchers of the impact of the financial crisis on mental health in Greece as well as of the pandemic crisis. Her work is reflected in over 800 international and Greek publications in impactful scientific journals and books, but also in brochures and scientific guides for patients and relatives with reference to schizophrenia, bipolar disorder, anxiety disorders and depression. Her educational activity includes more than 6000 hours of teaching, spanning across various types of teaching methods and settings – teaching at undergraduate, postgraduate, doctoral, and postdoctoral level in the context of direct clinical supervision, educational programs and seminars, workshops, and conferences. She has also established the Postgraduate Seminar "Psychoeducation: Interventions for the individual, family, and groups" (2004 –) addressed to mental health professionals.

Sissy Iliopoulou is an experienced corporate marketing, reputation & ESG strategist and business leader. She currently holds the position of Head of Marketing & Media at Lamda Development. 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Manolis Kellis, Professor of Computer Science & Artificial Intelligence, MIT

Manolis Kellis is a professor of computer science and artificial intelligence at MIT. He leads the MIT Computational Biology Group at MIT CSAIL and the Broad Institute of MIT and Harvard. His research seeks to understand the mechanistic basis of human disease, to develop new therapeutics that reverse disease circuitry, and to enable personalized medicine, using AI and machine learning to integrate genetics and genomics, single-cell epigenomics and transcriptomics, and high-throughput experiments, applied to Alzheimer's, Obesity, Cancer, Schizophrenia, Cardiovascular, and Immune Disorders. He helped lead several large-scale genomics projects, including Roadmap Epigenomics, ENCODE, Genotype Tissue-Expression (GTEx), and Comparative Genomics projects. He has authored over 280 journal publications cited more than 160,000 times. He received the US Presidential Award for Science and Engineering by Barack Obama, the Mendel Medal for Outstanding Achievements in Science, the NIH Director's Transformative Research Award, the Argo Science Award by the Hellenic President, the Boston Patent Law Association award, the NSF CAREER award, the Alfred P. Sloan Fellowship, the Technology Review TR35 recognition, the AIT Niki Award, and the Sprowls award for the best Ph.D. thesis in computer science at MIT. He has obtained more than 20 multi-year grants from the NIH, and his trainees hold faculty positions at Stanford, Harvard, CMU, McGill, Johns Hopkins, UCLA, and other top universities. He lived in Greece and France before moving to the US, and he studied and conducted research at MIT, the Xerox Palo Alto Research Center, and the Cold Spring Harbor Lab. 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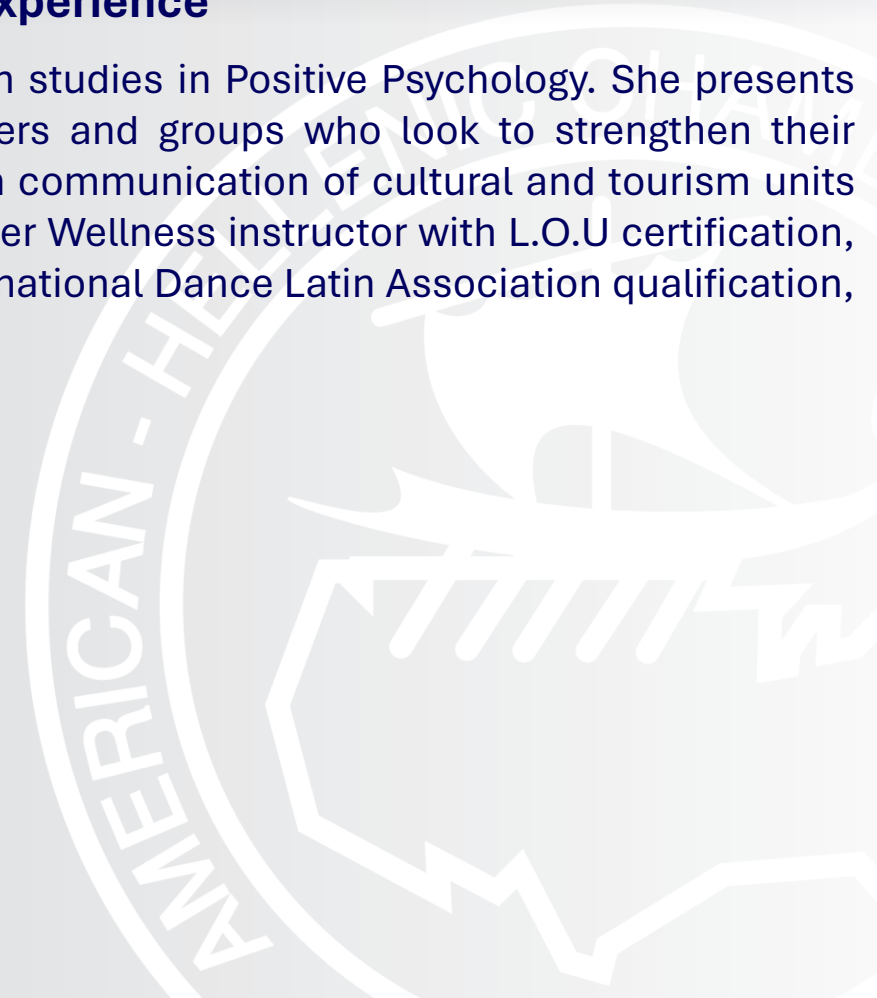
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Eleni Kontoravdi, Coordinator & Founder, The Laughter Experience

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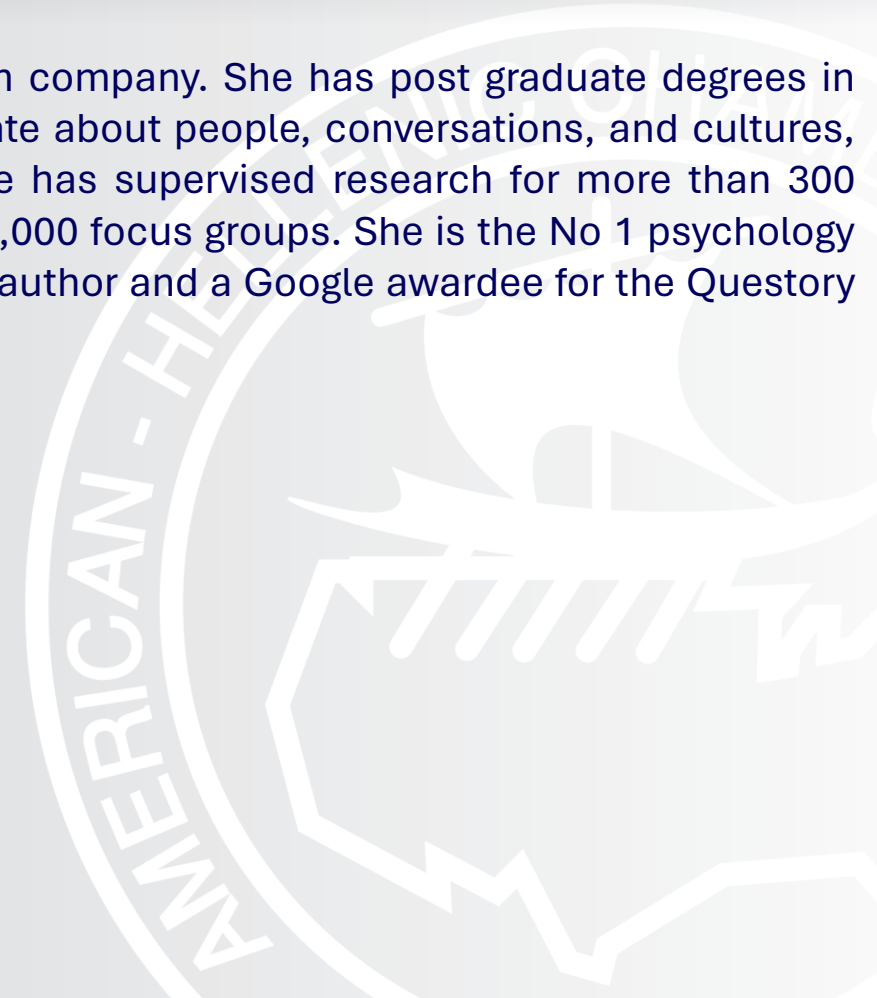
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Agnes Mariakaki, CEO, MindSearch

Lena Papaligoura was born in 1985 in Athens. She studied at Panteion University (Department of Media Communication and Culture) and at the Art Theatre. From 2006 when she finished Drama School until today, she has been working non-stop mainly in theater, but also in cinema and television. She has participated in the productions of the National Theatre, the Piccolo Teatro in Milan, the Art Theatre, the Poreia Theatre, the House of Letters and Arts, the Athens and Epidaurus Festival, the DIPETHE Agrini and the DIPETHE Veria and has collaborated in the theater with Greeks and foreigner directors (Arvanitakis, Gonis, Evagelatos, Theodorou, Kakleas, Kalabrianos, Kalbaris, Kokkos, Mastorakis, Mavrogeorgiou, Moumoulidis, Nanouris, Jean René Lemoine, Melleme, Paloubis, Tarlow, Triantaphyllis, Houvardas, Bob Wilson etc.) in works of classical and modern repertoire. She has also participated in Greek and foreign productions in cinema and television. In 2013, she was awarded for her performance as an immigrant prostitute in the play *Invisible Olga* by Giannis Tsiros, directed by George Paloubis, with the Merkouri award (best female performance for a young actress for 2012) and the distinction for new artist Karolos Koun. In 2015, she was awarded the third audience prize of the *Athinorama* magazine and the first readers' prize of the internet magazine *all4fun*, for her performance in the play *Katerina* based on the *Book of Katerina* by Auguste Certeau, directed by G. Lullaby. In 2023 for the film *Airhostess 737* by Thanasis Neofotistos, which premiered at the Locarno Festival and traveled to the most important film festivals in the world, it won 7 awards for best performance in a short film, including the Vimeo award at the Sundance festival, the Clermont-Ferrand Festival, and Premiere Nights Festival. In 2024 she was awarded by the Union of Greek Theater and Music Critics as well as the jury of the Koon Awards with the Commendation for Ancient Drama for her performance in the role of Sophocles' Electra, directed by Lilly Melleme.





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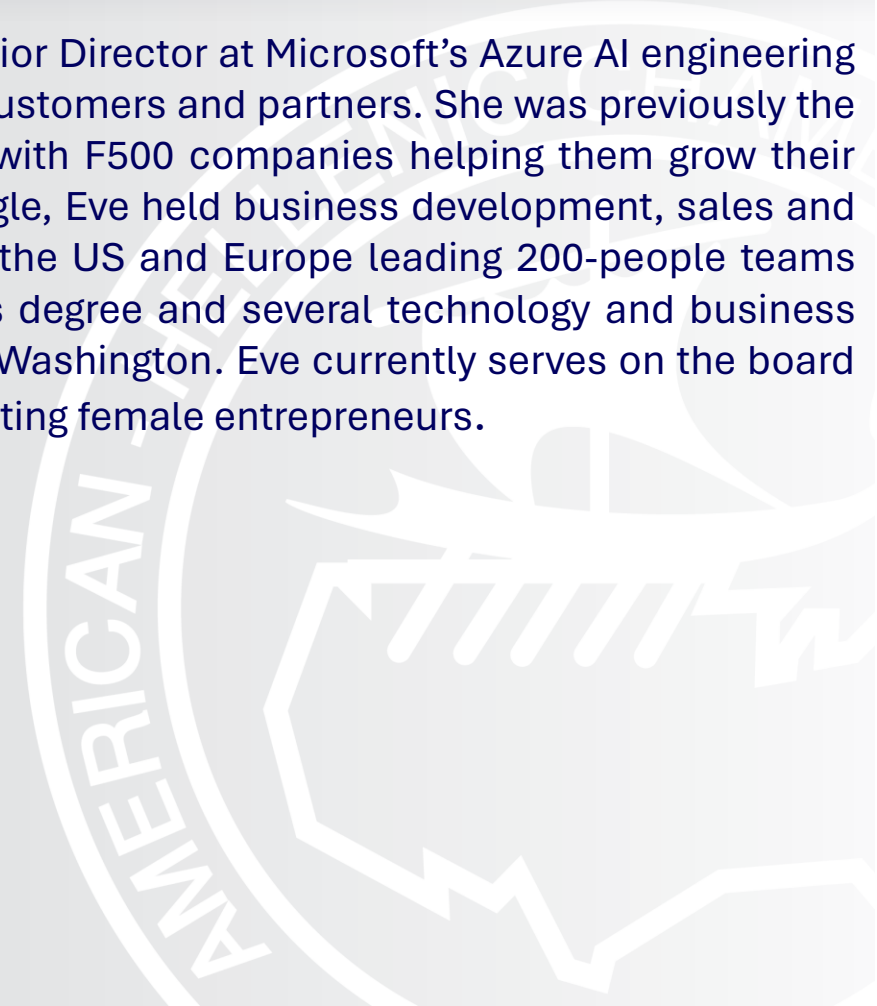


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Eve Psalti, Senior Director Artificial Intelligence Engineering, Microsoft

During his residence in the United States, he participated as a Research Engineer in several research programs in co-operation with other organizations and companies such as NASA, MIT, UNH in the fields of analog and digital electronics, circuits design and applications. He returned to Greece in 1992 and after completing his military service in 1994, he held the position of Technical Director for the subsidiary of the Italian company Citec SpA., a company specialized in the design, production and application of voice and image processing systems. From 1997 until February 2009, he worked for the Foundation of the Hellenic World, a major Greek private non-profit cultural organization, starting as a Construction Supervisor and continuing as a Managing Director of the brand new then Cultural Center, Hellenic Cosmos an innovative, based on new technologies, theme park. During his tenure, he contributed significantly to the expansion, development and operation of the Center and its establishment as one of the most known technology-driven cultural theme park in Greece and abroad. 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Elli Stai, Journalist

Elli Stai is a well-known Greek journalist with a successful career in both the press and broadcasting media. She has been the host of many popular talk shows and a main news anchor for most of the Greek broadcasters. She has won the Award of Best Greek News Anchor 5 times. She was born in Athens and studied Law at the Athens Law School and Political Science in Paris. She worked briefly as a lawyer but soon moved into journalism and began writing for Greek newspapers. She earned her first front-page story with an exclusive interview with Gianni Agnelli, the legendary Fiat owner. Her broadcasting career began in the public broadcasting corporation, ERT where, from 1982-1989, she anchored the flagship evening news program. She went on to work as a Brussels correspondent on European affairs for the Greek radio station FLASH. Upon her return to Athens, she hosted her own radio show for the Municipal radio station Radio Athens 98,4. In 1993, Elli Stai began working for the SKAI media group in both radio and television, where she anchored the main news program, introducing a more contemporary style of news presentation with live commentary and analysis. Between 1995 and 1997, she hosted the talk show “Ellispontos” for Mega Channel and then, for the next two years, Stai was the main presenter for the evening news at Star Channel. In 1999, she began working as a presenter for the Greek TV channel ANT1. She presented the very popular political show “Me ta matia tis Ellis” (Under Elli’s gaze). She went on to host it for seven years during which she ‘grilled’ a great number of Greek politicians, entertainers, and celebrities. For the three years leading up to October 4, 2006, she presented the evening news program for ANT1 Channel, which, during this period, dominated the Greek TV ratings. In February 2007, Elli Stai returned to the Greek TV broadcaster Mega Channel as an analyst for their evening news. She presented her own weekly news and analysis TV show called “Elli” until June 2007 when she moved to the TV station ALPHA where she appeared in political talk shows and co-anchored the main news. In December 2009, Elli Stai created her own news and opinion portal www.ellispoint.gr. In January 2011, she returned to the public broadcaster and the flagship NET television channel as the main news anchorwoman and host of the popular politics and current affairs show, Netweek. On June 1, 2013, she anchored the last main news bulletin before the sudden shutdown of the broadcaster. Since January 2014 till 2020 she was President and Editor-in-Chief of the news and web-TV portal The TOC, where she hosted the daily news show Newsroom.



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Myladie Stoubou, Senior Regional Director, Microsoft

Myladie Stoubou is an experienced digital executive, leader and strategist. She specializes in building and transforming global and diverse high-performance teams, as well as in assisting businesses to leverage opportunities from 4th industrial revolution and current exponential technologies. She has worn many hats in her professional career – started as systems engineer and a programmer, developing into a digital technology and innovation evangelist and later into a regional executive. His acclaimed works *Politics of Bios: On Irony* (Eurasia Publications, 2012) and *Castoriadis: A Philosophy of Autonomy* (Eurasia Publications, 2007) were awarded the Kautanzoglio Prize from the University of Athens. Additionally, *Digital Humanism: Iconistic Subject and Artificial Intelligence* (Armos, 2019) was nominated for the Greek National Book Award in Nonfiction 2020. His other notable works include: *En Mesi Odo* (Armos Publications, 2023), *Philosophy of Human Enhancement* (Armos Publications, 2021), *Politics of Life II: Self-Care in the Iconistic Society* (Armos Publications, 2017), *Pharmakon* (Eurasia Publications, 2011), *Physiological Findings* (Kedros Publications, 2001) – poetry collection, *Afternoons in Capitalism* (Typothito Publications, 2009) – poetry collection. He is also a respected translator, with works by Martin Heidegger, John Stewart Mill, Alexandros Nehamas, and Roberto Mangabeira Unger among his credits.

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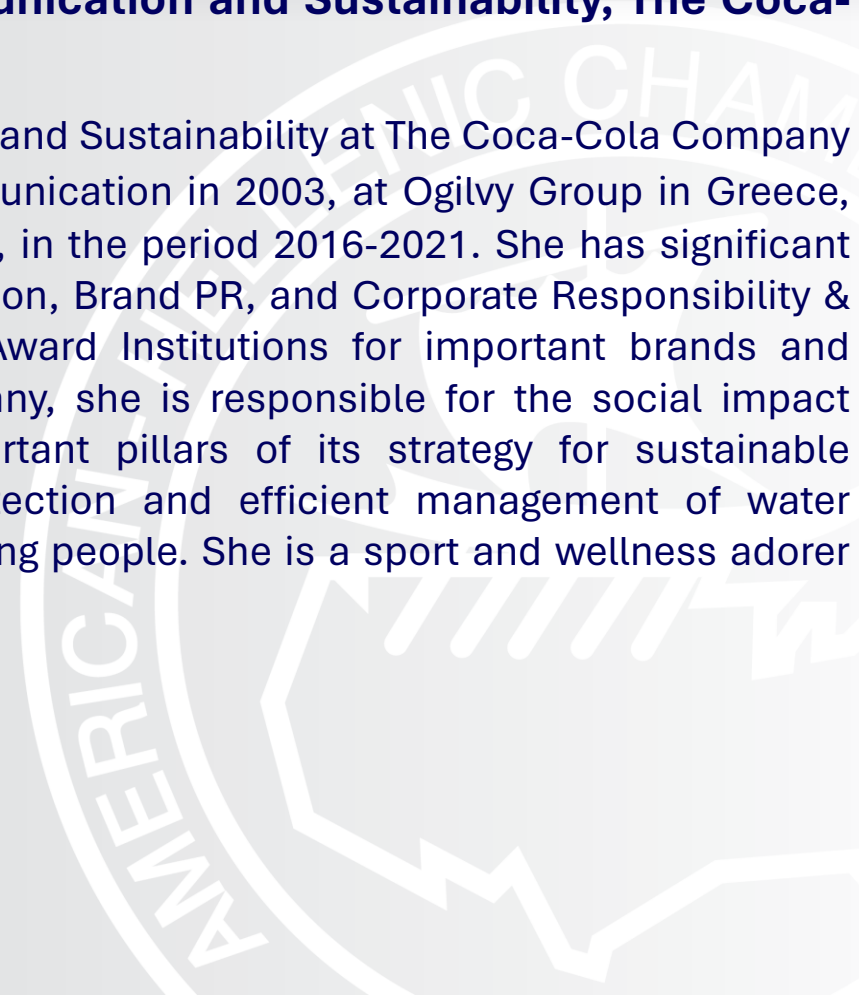
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Maria Tzelepi, Senior Director of Public Affairs, Communication and Sustainability, The Coca-Cola Company
