

Opportunities for All!

- The U.S. armaments cooperation community & Hellenic MoD, and the EU's European Defense Fund share a critical interest in developing world class military and dual-use technologies to safeguard are nations and alliances. This includes a variety of opportunities and players that share an interest in:
- C4ISR, Sensors, cyber, space, air defense, unmanned anti-submarine and seabed warfare, digital, quantum & disruptive technologies, circuits & semiconductors, energy & environment focused systems & capabilities, CBRN, MATCOMP, modelling & simulation, and PROTMOB.
- In the absence of offsets, industrial participation through networking is the key to foster collaborative relationships among companies, enabling each of you to leverage expertise and resources to enhance contributions to defense modernization projects, FMS, and direct sales.

Template for Success

- Several U.S. companies are playing a significant role in the modernization efforts of the Hellenic Armed Forces. Notable contributors include Lockheed Martin, which is involved in the F-35 and F-16V upgrades, as well as the MH-60R Seahawk and UH-60M helicopters, alongside P-3 upgrades and potential naval surface combatant ships. Honeywell and DuPont are supplying bullet-resistant jackets, while Erickson is delivering firefighting helicopters. Pratt & Whitney is manufacturing F-16 engines, and Raytheon provides F-16 avionics and weapons, including AMRAAM and Stinger missiles, along with the Patriot system. L3 Harris offers radios and F-16 upgrades, and Textron is producing Armored Security Vehicles for the Hellenic Army categorized as excess defense articles.
- The Hellenic U.S. Foreign Military Sales (FMS) portfolio contains over 150 active cases valued at approximately \$16.5 billion; with thousands of U.S. companies playing critical roles as suppliers of pieces and parts; while many others take on the robust aspects of engineering, integration, MRO, and logistics. Collectively, the U.S. industrial base plays a decisive role in enabling the Hellenic Ministry of National Defense's "Agenda 2030" modernization. DEFEA will be the premiere forum in 2025 to engage not just Greece, and the U.S., but to develop dynamic opportunities to support critical supply chains across 67 attendees from Europe, Asia, the Middle East, and Africa.
- Recent discussions with Greece suggest a strong interest in being considered as the next National Guard Bureau State Partner. In light of this, DEFEA 2025 stands as an excellent opportunity for states to showcase their capabilities and potential contributions.
